Dear Property Owner,

Congratulations on the purchase of your property. We hope you will find Barnstable an enjoyable place to live. Please take a moment to read the following information, since it may affect the amount of your tax obligation in the coming years.

The Town Council has the option of enacting a <u>residential exemption</u> of up to 20% of the <u>average</u> residential value in Barnstable for those property owners who maintain their <u>primary residence</u> in the Town of Barnstable. A primary residence is defined as being owned and occupied <u>as your primary domicile</u> and by filing federal tax returns showing the address of the property as the filing residence for the qualifying fiscal year. For example, to qualify <u>for FY2019</u>, which starts 7/1/2018, a property owner needs to submit a completed application along with a copy of the first page of their federal tax return from the 2017 calendar year. Applications are accepted starting July 1, the beginning of each applicable fiscal year. Since you have purchased your property after 1/1/2018, you will not qualify for FY19 but you may apply for FY20 after 7/1/2019. This exemption is enacted for one fiscal year only and must be voted on <a href="each">each</a> fiscal year by the Town Council. Once qualified, your exemption is valid until your primary residence status changes, the type of ownership of the property changes, or the Town Council votes not to accept the Clause. However, periodic requests for re-qualification may be required to ensure the integrity of the town's exemption files. Other statutory exemptions for the elderly, disabled veterans, etc., are also available, and information and applications for those are available on the Assessor's webpage.
